5. Academic Report

The following are brief highlights of academic events and activities undertaken or experienced throughout the year:

Very successful Leaving Certificate and Junior Certificate results

LC 2 students achieved 601 points and 7 more achieved over 500 points. 45% achieved over 400 points

JC - All our students performed well in the Junior certificate examinations. Expectations were exceeded in many instances.

Junior Cycle reform is on-going. Staff attended 2 Whole-School Continuous Professional Development days during the 2017-2018 academic year. Subject specifications came on stream for Art, Craft and Design, Modern Foreign Languages and Irish. A cluster in-service day was provided by PDST (Professional Development Service for Teachers) and a Whole School in-house day was facilitated by JCT.

Continuation with the School Self Evaluation (SSE) initiative. Literacy and numeracy are now embedded in teaching and learning in the college, as Strands 1 and 2. The SSE team has sub-divided into Literacy, Numeracy and 'Reflecting on learning' to make meetings more efficient and easier to organise. Work is on-going to continue this process in a constant self-evaluation and school improvement cycle. Future consideration is being made for the role out of the use of a Virtual Learning Platform for more efficient students/teachers, teacher/teacher and student/student sharing and communicating.

Three members of staff began a 2 year (4 sessions) Instructional Leadership programme to enhance instructional habits and techniques in the classroom thus making for a more agreeable learning experience.
